The Sun and the Moon do a dance with the Earth. In Transpersonal Astrology, we recognize a parallel between cycles in Nature and what takes place on Earth. We see the planets, Sun and Moon, as symbolic of psychological driving forces. We also acknowledge “Everything is foreseen but free-will is given,” taken from the Talmud.

In this column, our focus will be on the New and Full Moon cycles. We will discuss what they might suggest for us.

The New Moon occurs every 29-1/2 days. The Full Moon occurs midway between that cycle. New moons involve unification and new beginnings. Full moons parallel illumination or awareness, usually involving others.

November 1

New Moon in Scorpio

The new moon occurs late on November 1st. It is in the Aquarian “duad” of Scorpio; and these unifying energies strongly suggest comradeship. Individually and collectively, we are likely to see a transition in which people on Earth will be willing to enter new stages of experience for the opportunities they will present.

November 15

Full Moon in Taurus

This powerful cycle of illumination could manifest, for many, as a time to fight for their values and needs, and a time for exploration and discovery. However, since there is no “law of assertion” – only attraction – it might prove to be more successful when we focus on our values, rather than on what others are doing.

December 1

New Moon in Sagittarius

Many should find this to be a time of opportunity for personal growth; a time to focus on long-range desires and dreams. There can be a feeling of conflict, between choices involving forced growth, and the desire to simply be quietly open to higher inspiration.

December 15

Full Moon in Gemini

In this final two weeks of 2005 the probabilities are good that people will truly see that “stumbling blocks” are always “stepping stones”. This is a great time for resolving conflicts, communication, relatives, travel; and finding freedom and enjoyment as inhibiting circumstances are overcome. This illuminating/communicating time should also apply to the United States.
